



STAINED GLASS HAND APPLIQUÉ

1- or 2-day workshop **Workshop Supply List**

Come ready to be surprised at how easy this really is. I'll show you my method for making bias tape to use as the 'leading' in the windows, and teach you my stress-free appliqué techniques to sew any stained glass design you desire. All skill levels welcome.

This is a process class, where you will be exploring and learning various aspects of stained glass hand appliqué on this leaf pattern I provide. You will not be able to finish your project in this workshop but you will learn everything you need to know to complete it on your own. You can bring another design if you prefer. (If you bring a different design adjust fabric and freezer paper requirements accordingly.)



Before coming to class, wash all fabrics to make sure they are pre-shrunk and colorfast.

- Fabric for bias strips:** One fat quarter yard of dark cotton fabric. (This fabric for the window 'leading' will be cut and made into bias tape during class.)
- Fabric for leaf:** Four to eight green, or leaf-colored cotton fabrics. The leaf has eight segments, so you can bring a variety of eight fabrics, each measuring at least 5"x5", or bring one fat quarter.
- Fabric for surrounding glass:** 10"x10" cotton that would appear to be sky or other light background.
- Foundation Fabric:** 10"x10" muslin or white cotton fabric; very cheap, thin fabric works best. It is for the foundation of the stained glass project. None of this fabric will show on the finished project.
- Thread:** to match your bias strip fabric. I prefer cotton Aurifil (50 weight); OK to bring what you like.
- Freezer paper:** One 10"x10" piece
- Needle:** I prefer using a milliners/straw needle*, size 10 or 11, for my hand appliqué, but any THIN needle in the length you prefer will work just fine.
- Straight pins*:** Bring at least 8-10 pins.
- Fabric scissors* and thread snippers**
- Rotary tools:** mat, cutter, ruler (at least 18" long would be preferable). If you don't own rotary equipment, don't buy it just for this class – we can share.
- Ruler:** for drawing straight lines. 6" or 12" office style ruler, or rotary ruler.
- Chalk pencil or other temporary marking tool:** a color that will show on your background fabric.
- Empty toilet paper or paper towel cardboard roll:** just need one.
- Clover ¼" Bias Tape Maker*.** No other brand works as well, so buy the **Clover brand*.** Clover color-codes their bias tape makers, so get the one with GREEN plastic. Clover makes two versions of their ¼" bias tape maker—one that works with fusible, and one that does not. I prefer the one for non-fusible, but the other will work if that's all you can find.
- Light box:** This can be helpful. Don't buy one just for this class – we can share.
- Optional items:** reading glasses, thimble, needle threader*, portable light*.
